Pastor's Pen...

I am very excited about my September sermon series. This past July, I got to spend a week traveling around England visiting locations central to the life of Methodism's founder, John Wesley. Wesley was born in 1703 in a small English village called Epworth. He studied in Oxford and became a professor there. He spent years preaching all across England. I had the privilege to visit Epworth, Oxford, Bristol, and London standing where Wesley once stood in several churches and other spaces.

My travels took me from small villages to enormous cathedrals, to lonely crossroads in the middle of nowhere. Wesley was said to travel thousands of miles each year, all on horseback. He was a prolific preacher. Even in the small village of Epworth, there are multiple locations around the town where he is said to have preached. Plaques on houses all over Oxford and London attest to the same. I was lucky enough to stand in several of the spots where he delivered his sermons.

I am looking forward to sharing with you pictures and videos of my travels. I am especially looking forward to sharing with you the deeper understanding of this thing we call Methodism. I got to walk in his footsteps and learn more about the man himself. John Wesley was not just the founder of a new movement. He, and those who served with him, transformed the soul of the English people. His biblical concern for the poor was a cultural shift from the aristocracy-controlled Church of England. The

Methodist movement in England led to a cultural and religious revolution.

His concern for the poor and outcast caused Wesley to become a bit of an outcast himself. Eventually, he was not welcomed in any Anglican Churches including his home church. One time returning to Epworth to preach, he stood outside the church on top of his father's grave, because it was technically the property of the family and the pastor couldn't kick him out. Whether it was on a grave, in St Paul's Cathedral, or under a large tree in the countryside, Wesley preached and shared the Good News of a loving caring God, who cares about each of us, and calls us to share that love with those in need and indeed with all God's children.

Each Sunday in September, I will focus on a different location that I visited, and share with you a little of John Wesley's own words, and hopefully inspire you in the same way that Wesley inspired a generation. Together, we will discover what it means to be Methodist. I look forward to seeing you there. Remember, if you can't make one of the Sundays that they are all recorded and available on YouTube.

Friday Morning Bible Study


Acts of the Apostles

Wednesday Evening Bible Study



First off, thank you so much for your generosity so far this year! The Mission Team still needs your help with donations for Silver Creek Food Pantry and Exit 0.

As the new school year is here, please bring in hygiene products (especially deodorant) for those students who use the Silver Creek Food Pantry.

There is a donation container for this charity in the entry hall between the Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary.

For Exit 0, we continue to need supplies for the Snack Bags and toiletries.

Here are the lists as a refresher:

SNACK BAGS

The following items are needed for each snack bag:

A gallon size plastic bag – 1 can of meat (Tuna or chicken salad kits, potted meat, Spam, Vienna Sausage – pop top cans) – 1 granola breakfast bar – 1 bottle of water – 1 flavored drink packet – 1 Pop Tart (Donuts, Little Debbie's, Snack Cakes, etc.) – 1 Slim Jim – 1 Variety Snack Bag (Chips, Gold Fish, Cheese Nips, Pretzels, etc.) – 1 Peanut Butter Cracker or Cheese Cracker packet – 1 Fruit Cup including plastic spoon or fork – 5 pieces of wrapped hard candy – 1 Pair of socks

HYGIENE PRODUCTS

While we are no longer making bags or kits of Hygiene products, we are still collecting the items and delivering them in bulk. Here are some of the products that they need:

Wash Rags – Body Wash (2 in 1) – Bars of soap – Deodorant – Disposable Razors, Q Tips – Tampons/Pads – Toothbrushes – Toothpaste – Combs – Pairs of Socks – Travel size Lotion – Travel size Hand Sanitizer – Travel size First Aid Kits

In the Fellowship Hall, there are totes labeled Snack Bags and Hygiene Bags in which people can drop their donated items or the bags which they have assembled. You can buy one thing or lots of things. Every little bit helps the homeless Exit 0 serves. When we have enough finished bags to fill boxes, they will be delivered to Exit 0 for distribution. This will be an ongoing mission project for 2025, so donations will be needed all year.

SUMC Missions Team

We have multiple adult Sunday School classes, classes for children, and nursery care starting at 9am, downstairs and in the Fellowship Hall.



Rev Dr Gary Schaar's class meets in the Fellowship hall each Sunday morning. This class is ideal for those with mobility issues, since it is on the same floor as the sanctuary. Bathrooms are located nearby. Rev. Schaar's class dives into books of the Bible to find meaning and understanding their place in the story of God's love.

Janet Werle's class meets in room 2 in the church basement. They often use video studies which highlight themes throughout the Bible including history, theology, and faith development. The use of video makes this class unique.

Children are encouraged to come to Sunday School as well. Our teachers **Donna Moore**, and **Brenda Croucher** are here each Sunday, to nurture and teach the Good News that God loves each and everyone one of us. They meet in **room 8** in the church basement.

Nursery Care is also available Sunday mornings in the church basement, room 9.
