"Be to me a rock of refuge, to which I may continually come; you have given the command to save me, for you are my rock and my fortress." Thus reads the third stanza of Psalm 73. Our God is a steadfast anchor upon which we are invited by Grace to rely. This analogy captures the hearts of believers today as it did in the days of the Apostles. Exemplary in these prayers is the hymn we call *Rock of Ages*.

Penned in 1775 by Anglican minister Augustus Toplady, there is an often repeated fable of its writing. The story goes that Toplady, while traveling through a valley in the north of England, was struck by a storm. To seek shelter, he wedged himself among the rocks and was inspired at that moment to write the hymn's opening lines. Though this story is likely a later fabrication it yet illustrates just the same longing for shelter in life that leads us all to walk as Christians.

Whether He is to you a firm foundation on which to build your life, an anchor on which to rest the weary, or the shelter from wrath, we remember that God is the rock of all of our lives.


