# Pastor's Pen...

February brings together 2 holidays steeped in tradition within the Christian Church. Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day. The way we celebrate Valentine's Day these days may not seem to have much to do with the church, outside of its connection generally to love. Perhaps we should revisit the story of St Valentine and Lent.

One story of a St Valentine comes from the 3rd century when Rome was still persecuting Christians. Valentine had been put in jail for his Christian beliefs, and there it is said he performed a miracle by restoring sight to the jailer's daughter. He also performed Christian marriages for those the Roman government had forbidden to marry. The story then concludes that right before his death he sent a note to the jailer's daughter and signed it, "Your Valentine." Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent which is a season of the church year leading up to Easter. It is roughly 40 days long and is based on the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness fasting and being tempted. Both of these stories are about people who are separated from society, suffer, and yet stay committed to worshiping God.

We may not think of Valentine's day in terms of suffering for our love of Christ. Yet, we must acknowledge that loving God and loving our neighbors can require sacrifice.

Traditionally, Christians are asked to suffer by giving up something for the 40 days of Lent. Choices often include things like TV, Chocolate, or Coffee. I want to suggest, however, that we think of Lent in a slightly different way. Rather than focusing on the bad habits you want to give up, focus on the good habits you want to start. Below is a list of things to fast from and to. If we can make these changes, I believe this Lent will truly be a transformative experience for you and for our church.

#### **FASTING FOR LENT**

**Fast** from hurting words and speak kind words.

**Fast** from jealousy and be filled with gratitude.

Fast from anger and be filled with patience.

Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.

Fast from worries and trust in God.

**Fast** from complaints and contemplate simplicity.

Fast from pressures and be prayerful.

Fast from bitterness and be filled with joy.

**Fast** from selfishness and be compassionate to others.


**Fast** from grudges and be reconciled.

#### SPECIAL EVENING LENTEN STUDY SERIES





A prayer for protection, for wisdom and guidance, these are the themes of the popular hymn *Be Thou My Vision*. A translation of an Irish hymn dating to the 6th or 8th century often attributed to Saint Dallán, an English language translation was published by Mary E. Byrne in 1905 and set to verse by Eleanor Hull in 1912. This version was later set to the tune of the Irish folk song *Slane*. This version became the standard put into hymnary.

The third verse of the 1912 version opens "Be Thou my battle shield, sword for the fight". This line is derived from Paul's letter to the Ephesians, imploring them to take up the shield of faith and the sword of the Spirit as part of the whole armor of God that they would be defended and bolstered against evil. These armaments aren't literal steel and bronze, but a metaphor for the security that trust and faith in God provides. This was an important passage to the medieval Irish, harried as they were by enemies of the flesh both Christian and pagan. It is still important to us today.

Though the Methodist hymnal does not include the third verse, and the English translations already reduce the original 8 Gaelic verses to 5,

it is a worthy exercise to dig into the meanings and scripture present in the songs we sing.

#### **Pastor Staff Parish Relations**

With the dawn of a New Year, this article is written to help our congregation better understand how we, as the *Laity*, can serve Jesus Christ. The information lists two ways we can serve and an educational opportunity.

First, at our Indiana Annual Conference in June each year, there must be a balance of Clergy and Lay Members who attend or at least register. There are a number of retired clergy persons who have full rights, so a layperson is needed to add balance. In the South District we do not have a balance and therefore need an additional 11 laypersons to attend as Equalizing Lay Members. Conference dates this year are June 6-8 at St. Luke's UMC in Indianapolis, IN. Food, hotel accommodations and travel are at the lay member's expense but there are South District funds that can help anyone requesting a stipend.

To secure these laity members, there is a District Conference meeting where we vote on those who wish to serve as an equalizing member. Anyone who would like to be considered for one of the Equalizing positions and attend Annual Conference with voting privileges must fill out a "Willingness to Serve" form. Go to inumc.org/annual-conference and click on the Equalization Member Equalization Willingness to Serve. The registration deadline is February 1, 2024.

By filling out the Registration Form, you are volunteering to serve as a South District Equalizing member, but you won't know until the district votes on March 3rd. If there are 20 volunteers from the South District and only 11 needed, then some will not be elected. If you have questions please contact Janet Werle or Pastor John Demaree.

At the Annual Conference there is worship, training, plenary sessions, dinners and fellowship

times to share where you can hear, see and feel God's spirit in action with the United Methodist Church.

Another opportunity to better serve our Lord comes with the decision to further your training through the Lay Servant Academy. Lay Servants are those individuals who wish to serve in ministry areas such as serving children, visitation, lay speaking and many other ways.

Throughout The Indiana Conference there are classes offered for Certified Lay Servants (basic), Certified Lay Speakers (advanced) and Certified Lay Ministers (advanced). These classes start with the Basic Course and depending on the certification level desired, additional classes may be taken. Many classes are offered on ZOOM, require 10 hours of classwork and result in the certification of Lay persons better equipped to serve Jesus Christ and his church. There are costs of time and money but the costs outweigh the benefits of serving God. Classes are offered in both English and Spanish but not for every date on the calendar.

CS Mitch Gieselman will be offering one more opportunity in January to attend a training session for Pastors, Staff Parish Committee members and anyone interested in the work of our PSPR Team, via Zoom. #### FINANCIAL REPORT FOR 2023

Below is the Financial Report for Sellersburg United Methodist Church for Year Ending 2023:

• Giving in 2023. Total Giving for the Year 2023 was \$210,395.84. The Total Giving for the previous year of 2022 was \$243,729.31, which was less than 2022 by \$33,333.47. It should be noted that the 2022 total included the proceeds from the annual Pig Roast of \$4,329, whereas 2023 did not include these totals.

The Giving for 2023 was the lowest giving since before 2010, the last year that giving records are readily available.

- Giving in 2023 in Comparison to Budget. The Budget for 2023 was \$240,671.78 as established by the church's Governing Board on 23Jan23. Giving was \$30,275.94 less than the required Budget.
- Giving vs. Expenses in 2023. For the year 2023, Expenses exceeded Giving by \$756.97.

The church remains current in their obligations to the United Methodist Church as well as other bills and obligations.

 Gift from an Estate. The church received a gift from an Estate of a long-time church member. The gift was approximately \$16,000 received in late November and was placed temporarily in the Trust and Memorial Designated Fund of the church, until directed otherwise by the family.
