Pastor's Pen...

There is a guidance of scripture readings called a lectionary that many churches follow. This guide is divided into three years, A, B, and C. This year, the church is in year B. As such, this year's scriptures surrounding Jesus' last days, trial, death and resurrection come from the story as told in the Gospel of Mark. I have the privilege of not only planning our Sunday morning worships, but also 2 very special Easter week worship services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. These two services on Thursday, March 28th, and Friday, March 29th, will be presented by the pastors and members of 8 different United Methodist churches all coming together in worship. They will both be held at our church in Sellersburg.

Since I was able to plan them along with Palm Sunday on March 24th and Easter Sunday on March 31st, I designed all 4 to be one continuous story through the Gospel of Mark. Those who are able to attend all 4 services will hear the complete story as the Gospel of Mark tells it. For many people, Easter often jumps from the triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday straight to the Resurrection on Easter morning. There is a lot to the story, however, in between those two events. This year, I invite you to attend all 4 services and hear the whole story. There is so much more power in the Resurrection when you remember everything that happened leading up to it.

In the weeks after Easter, we will continue the story in the Gospels of John and Luke as we look at Jesus' appearances to his disciples and others after his resurrection. This journey will take us all the way to the celebration of Pentecost in mid-May. If you can remember only parts of the story, this sermon series from Palm Sunday through Pentecost is a great way to see the whole picture and understand how all of the pieces fit together. I hope you will join us in-person or view the worship services on YouTube.



#### **SPECIAL EVENING LENTEN STUDY SERIES**




On Wednesday evenings at 6:45pm through March 27th, Pastor John is leading a special Lenten series in room 2. The series is titled "Being United Methodist Christians." For those new to the United Methodist Church, and those who have been members for decades, this is a class of remembering our roots, what makes us distinctive, and how the love of Christ works through our church to transform lives and communities. We are using the video series "Being a United Methodist Christian" as a starting place each week and then diving into our history, our beliefs, our traditions, and our call to social justice. Whether you are thinking about joining our church, or want a deeper, richer understanding of our connection as United Methodist, this Lenten study is for you. The series began on February 21st but please come join us any week!



#### FRIDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY

The Friday morning Bible Study group will start a new series on April 5th entitled John: The Gospel of the Light and Life. This new 6-week study will look deeply into the message and meaning of the Gospel of John. John's gospel is different in many ways from the other 3 gospels. Come learn why that is and the special place the Gospel of John has in the Bible and our understanding of Jesus. All are welcome to

attend the study. We meet every Friday morning at 10am in room 2, which is in the basement of the church. Entry is easiest through the back door which faces the parking lot behind the church.



The Wednesday evening Lenten Study Group has decided to continue meeting on Wednesday evenings. On April 3rd we will start a new study called "The Bible Project." This study will take a close look at the first 5 books of the Old Testament and how the themes and stories connect to each other and tell and overall story about God and our relationship with God. The class meets every **Wednesday evening at 6pm downstairs in room 2**. Visitors are always welcome, even if you can't come every week.

'All glory, laud, and honor to thee, redeemer King' have sung many Christians around the world on Palm Sunday. Like so many hymns, those lifting their voices in praise may not know the age of the melodies and lyrics they vocalize. Originally penned in Latin by an imprisoned bishop as 'Gloria, laus, et honor' in the time of Charlemagne, this hymn was later set to music and translated to English in the 1850s and 60s. Though many of the original Latin verses are not often sung in worship, *All Glory, Laud, and Honor* continues to be the archetypal example of a Palm Sunday song.

As is written therein, it is in the time of Easter and amidst all times and places that we sing the praises of our great redeemer who has purchased us and for us with his blood. He rode into Jerusalem on donkeyback and had laid before him palm leaves. He left Jerusalem freed from the toll of sin and

Himself risen to sit at the right hand of the Lord. We remember these mighty acts.

#### Indiana Conference Toronado Response

On March 10th, Pastor John spoke about the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) and how on one Sunday a year, United Methodist Churches around the globe take a special offering that pays for the salary of the small UMCOR staff and their part-time trainers and consultants. There is even a bit left over that is set aside for emergency grants that are given in the first days after a disaster to bring in water and other essential supplies to a devastated area. Thank you to all who donated on that Sunday. I have personally met many of the UMCOR Staff members, consultants, and trainers at three Disaster Response Academies. They are all hardworking and dedicated.

Pastor John also announced that I am now the South District Disaster Response Coordinator. I am sure many of you are asking, but what does that mean? It means that if there is a tornado, flood, or extensive storm damage in one of the communities in the South District of the Indiana Annual Conference, I will reach out to the United Methodist pastor nearest the damaged area. If needed, I will meet with the pastor, and assess in broad terms what type of help is needed (e.g., debris removal, tarping of roofs, etc.). I will then report those needs back to the Conference Disaster Response Coordinators, Rev. John Young and Ron Heustis, who are in charge of the next stage of help, the Emergency Response Teams (ERTs).

As you are probably aware, tornadoes touched down on Thursday, March 14th, in the following Indiana counties: Randolph, Delaware, Jefferson, and Switzerland. None of these counties are in our district but all of them have homeowners who could use assistance. Please continue to pray for all those who have been affected, directly and indirectly. Financial contributions can be given either to UMCOR U.S. Disaster

The Early Response Teams (ERTs) are trained volunteers who are willing and able to go to disaster areas after emergency responders (e.g., fire, police, national guard,etc.) have completed rescuing people and the area is safe enough for ERTs. Indiana disaster ERTs have begun to clean up debris and tarp roofs in these counties. If you are interested in being trained as someone who responds in this way, please reach out to me as I just went through the training in February. If this is a way you want to respond but do not think you can physically do it, please speak to me as each team member has different roles.

If you are interested in learning more about any of the above or what happens next in recovering from these tornadoes, please feel free to ask me about it.
